
# ► Hokkaido Earthquake: Assistance Activities Report

It has been over two months since the Hokkaido Eastern Iburi Earthquake that struck on September 6th. We would like to give our supporters an update on our emergency assistance activities which we began since the onset of the disaster.





# Procurement and Delivery of Relief Items

Immediately following the disaster, we conducted a preliminary needs assessment. In coordination with the municipality, the private sector, and partner NGOs we delivered relief items to evacuation centers and to victims at home.





#### Search-and-Rescue

On the day of the disaster, the SAR team immediately deployed to Atsuma, one of the towns hit hardest by the quake, by helicopter and airplane. The team, including doctors, nurses, and rescue dogs, searched through the debris for three days.



#### Leased Trailers

We leased several trailers and lent them to the municipality and NGOs working tirelessly to provide emergency assistance. The trailers were utilized as office spaces and break rooms.
